3. ACTION ITEM: Vote Community Member Shanelle Patterson as Co-Chair	Reuben Moreno, Co-Chair
<p>Co-Chair Reuben Moreno provided a brief background on the reason for transfer of Co-Chair to Community Member, Shanalle Patterson. 4. Transition Age Youth Data Workgroup	Jacqueline White, Member
<p>Member White gave a brief description on the needs of forming the workgroup and clarified that it's for youth who are transitioning to the community. The workgroup will gather information and present their findings to the committee. JJCC Realignment members interested in forming this workgroup will email Member White. JJCC Realignment Meeting Facilitator reflected that the group must be less than a quorum, meet on their own time and no decisions are to be made in the workgroup.</p>	



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5. Update on Credible Messenger Workgroup	Rueben Moreno, Shanalle Patterson, and Abel Diaz, Members
<p>Member Patterson mentioned they have met to discuss the tasks of the credible messenger, and determined there are two roles in one position, in which they would like to separate. They would like the credible messenger to be able to work with county agencies and be able to measure outcomes. In addition, they would like to know what funds would be available and what it would look like if the credible messenger is through a CBO. Member Diaz suggested looking at other organization's established credible messenger programs may give a better idea of how to create our program.</p> <p>Member Judge Lindquist reflected she had questions about receiving feedback from the credible messenger and where the position would be housed. Co-Chair Moreno and Members Diaz and Patterson informed Member Judge Lindquist that funding would be provided through the JJCC Realignment Block Grant and the Credible Messenger would be integrated into the Youth Re-entry Team, and the position would be filled by a CBO representative working in collaboration with the team.</p> <p>The Credible Messenger Program is currently in the planning phase, and the workgroup will present proposed ideas along with an outline of the role and responsibilities at a future meeting.</p>	
6. Update on Pine Grove/Fire Camps	Jamal Rowe, Chair
<p>YDF Chief Deputy McDonald gave an update of Pine Grove Fire Camp. She went over data, including the number of youths sent to Pine Grove. She noted VOYA youth have assisted in the Tiger Fire, Bonanza, Boneyard, Coyote and TCU Complex Fire. She reflected they are on alert and ready to respond to incidents. The Pine Grove Fire camp is a very successful program, and she is looking for ways to increase interest in the program.</p>	
7. Dedicated Housing Site Supervision Discussion	Abel Diaz and Shanalle Patterson, Members
<p>Member Diaz briefly went over the discussion of having a full-time person located at the houses to watch over the youth and assist them in making better choices.</p>

<p>Chair Rowe conducted a roll call of the candidates and noted that candidate Lee Farrand was absent. JJCC Realignment Meeting Facilitator went over the directions and process of the interviews. The committee interviewed the candidates present: Dennis Dulay, Atenceia Mari and Jarad Nava.
