Judge Lindquist commented that court has never given an update in the Juvenile Delinquency Prevention Commission (DPC) and that she did not have any updates to report.

CD McDonald gave an update on the horticulture program at YDF as well as the development of a youth council which will focus on opening communication and engagement with the youth. In addition, a DPO has been assigned as a grievance officer, with reported results of a decrease in grievances.

CD Marietti updated the committee on the construction being done in the next couple weeks

There was discussion in regards to vocational training and job skills for the youth so they are better prepared when they re-enter the community.

Public Defender Reuben Moreno gave an update on the changes in the Public Defender's office, including the amount of attorneys, and their day-to-day operations.

The Representative from Conflict Criminal Defenders updated the committee on the changes in their office as well as gave a brief description of their process and operations. A challenge was brought up in regards to youth not able to call their lawyer.

John Grimes from the District Attorney's office spoke about the alarming cases that involve youth and guns – from kids carrying them and to bringing them to school.

There was open discussion on how to bring awareness to youth in schools and mention of a previous program, Guns Information for Teens (GIFT) that was presented in schools about the implications of gun related crimes.

The Representative from SCOE provided updates on his department including working with CD McDonald from Probation's Youth Detention Facility (YDF) on the Horticulture Program. He also mentioned partnering with Office of Youth and Community Restoration (OYCR) on educational opportunities. They will also be interviewing for a new Principal for the Youth Detention Facility.
