Chair welcomed the committee and informed them about previous Chief Probation Officer Marlon Yarber's retirement in December of 2024.

Abel Diaz was the recommended candidate for the community member position in the JJCC Realignment Subcommittee. He was voted for and confirmed in by the JJCC Main Body meeting that was held on January 14, 2025.

Sacramento County held a Budget Process webinar online in December 2024, which entailed the process and procedures that County follows. An email was sent out prior to the webinar to all committee members with information on joining the meeting.

Probation has recently posted the scope of services of all the contracts that are in place for the VOYA population. These can be found on the Probation public website for the public to view. Contracts include community outreach, housing, program services and support services.

Chair acknowledged 7 youth from Pinegrove Fire Camp are currently helping to battle the Los Angeles Fires. For Less Restrictive Programs (LRP), Probation currently has two contracts, one with Elijah House and another with People Working Together. Probation has recently toured Good Cause Sacramento which is a female re-entry housing provider that will serve up to 12 young females and provide full wrap-around services.

### 6. TAMI Project

Shanelle Patterson, Member

Committee Member Shanelle Patterson informed the committee that the TAMI Project, a program through UC Davis, is not available for youth that are on secure track in VOYA. She would like for the TAMI project to consider continuing their services to the youth, no matter what their status may be. She suggested to the committee to have a representative from the TAMI project conduct a presentation on the services they offer the youth.

Chair asked the Chief Deputy over Youth Detention/VOYA if we had a contract with the TAMI project. It was confirmed that we did not have a contract with TAMI Project. UC Davis does not provide mental health services to the youth. The contract in place for these services is with County Behavioral Health Services. It was recommended to have Dr. Quist from Behavioral Health Services, who is also a member of the committee, present the services and processes that are given to the youth.

# 7. Lapse of medical care for youth re-entering community and services for girls

Shanelle Patterson, Member

Committee Member Shanelle reflected that she has heard from youth that some of the medical services, in particular pregnancy care, has not been complete. She would like to be informed about what medical services are provided to those youth with pre-existing conditions. She mentioned that she is glad that Probation is offering and looking into options for the female youth population, particularly those going through step downs or re-entering the community. Chair mentioned that the Chief Deputy for Juvenile Courts, Brad Marietti, investigated female fire camps as an option for our female youth. He was informed that they are offered through the state prisons. Options for the youth are constantly being looked for and Chair invited the members to share any ideas that could be possible leads.

YDF Clinical Manager, Pam Gandy, will be invited to the next JJCC Realignment meeting to present the medical services offered to the youth.
