# Keeping Our Community Safe

## ALL DISTRICTS

### Countywide After Hours Sweep

On November 9, 2021, Probation officers assigned to the Gang Suppression Unit conducted an operation in Sacramento County contacting known gang members and associates. Officers conducted probation searches with the intent of suppressing and preventing future gang related violence.



#### Sweep Results:

Warrant Arrests:	Felony (2)
Total Arrests:	Three (3)



## DISTRICT 1

November 4, 2021

3000 Block of Great Falls Way, Sacramento  
Juvenile Field Officers with the Age of Majority unit assisted the Sacramento Sheriff's Office Gang Unit serve a search warrant on a minor on probation who had posted photos of videos with two firearms online. In one of the photos, the individual was shown pointing a gun in the direction of a small child. Officers contacted the individual at home, and a search revealed two firearms matching the description of those in the photo and video. On November 8, 2021, officers arrested the individual on charges of Wrongful Possession of a Firearm and Possession of Ammunition by a Prohibited Person.



## DISTRICT 2

November 23, 2021,

6600 Block of Rancho Pico Way, Sacramento  
Officers assigned to the Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS) South Unit, conducted a residential search of an adult on PRCS. Officers recovered a non-serialized handgun (ghost gun), a



box of ammunition, oxycodone pills, and narcotic paraphernalia. The adult was arrested and is pending charges of Felon in Possession of a Firearm, Possession of Ammunition by a Prohibited Person, and Unlawful Possession of Controlled Substances.

## DISTRICT 3

November 11, 2021

4400 Block of Oak Hollow Drive, North Highlands  
Officers with the Juvenile Field Impact Unit conducted a home visit of a youth. Officers observed the youth hide something in the couch and delay opening the door. A search was conducted, and officers recovered marijuana, prescription medication, a Glock style BB gun, two knives, a scale, and drug paraphernalia.



## DISTRICT 5

November 18, 2021

8700 Block of Heathermist Way, Elk Grove  
Juvenile Field Officers from the Community Based Supervision unit led a planned operation to conduct a probation search at the home of a youth. During the search, officers located a stolen loaded Walter P-22 semi-automatic handgun. The youth was arrested for Minor in Possession of a Firearm, Minor in Possession of Live Ammunition, and Receiving Stolen Property.

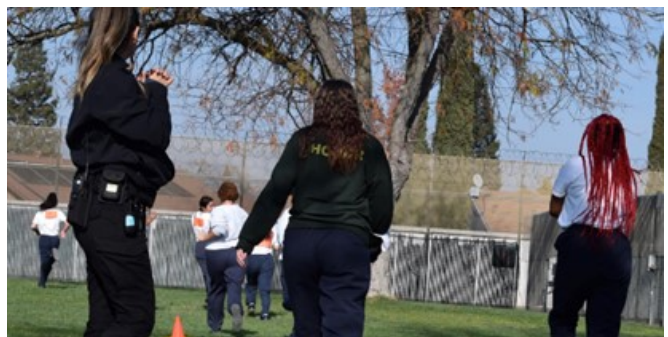


### The Fastest Man Finals



Residents competed head to head in a timed 100-yard dash. The top time was 10.06 seconds.

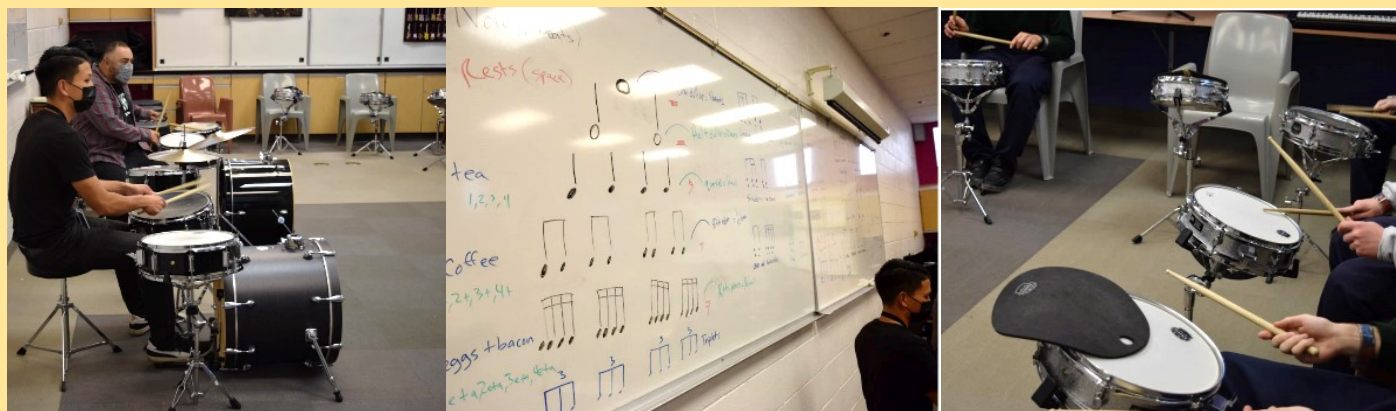
### Turkey Trot Games - Fun in the Field and on the Court

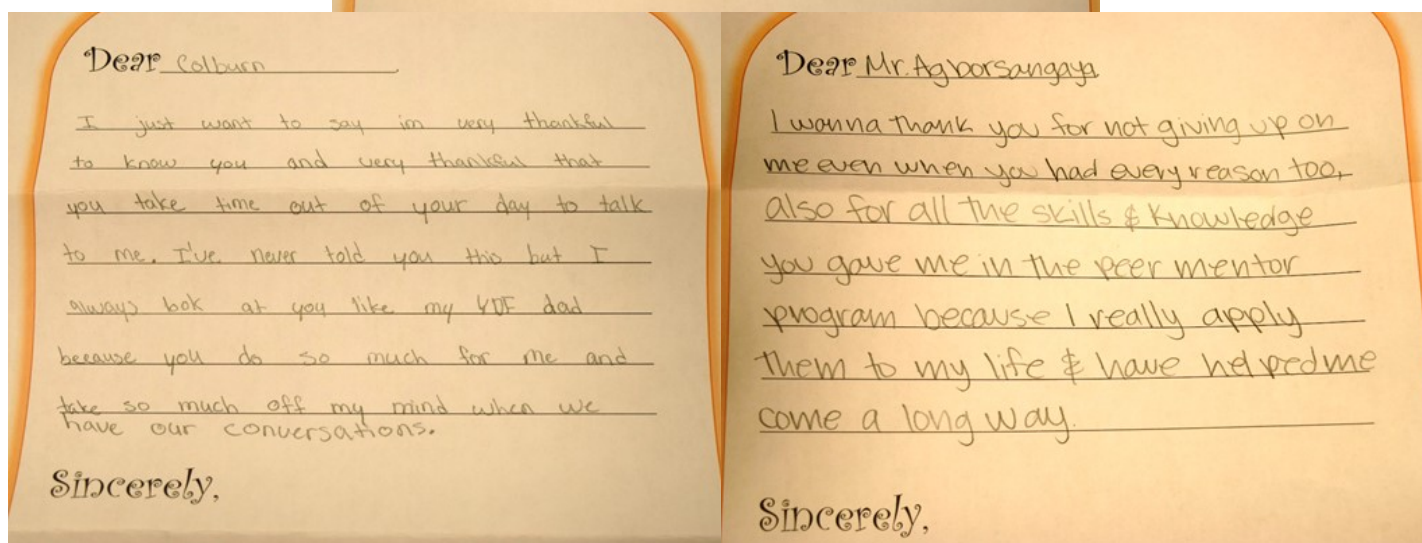
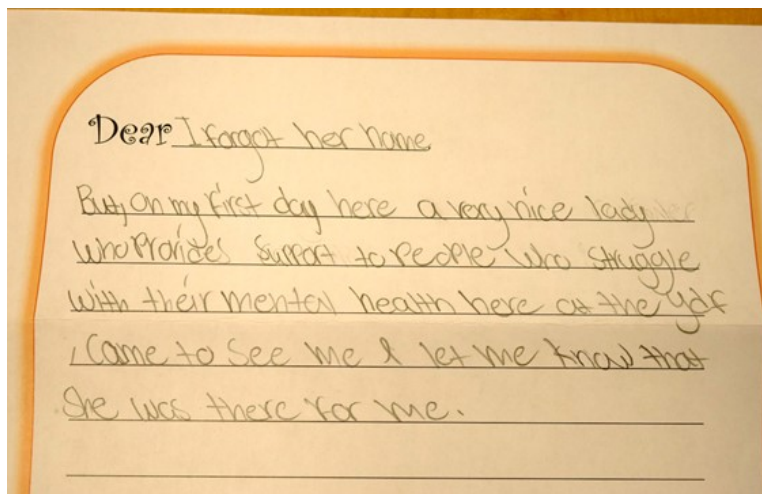

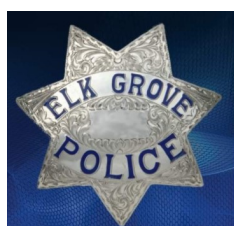
