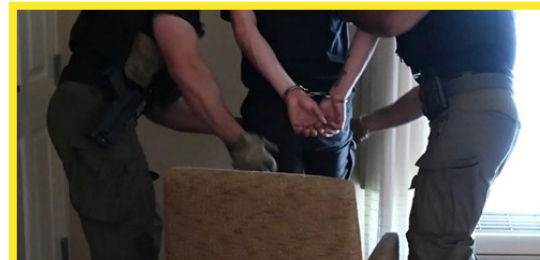

## Multi-Agency Human Trafficking Operation

The [Sacramento County Sheriff's Office](#) in conjunction with the [District Attorney's Office](#), Sacramento County Probation, [Sacramento Police Department](#), the [Federal Bureau of Investigation \(FBI\)](#), and other local agencies conducted a large-scale operation combating human trafficking.

The three-week operation in April spanned across Sacramento County and aimed at targeting sex buyers and human traffickers. The operation yielded 102 arrests, 31 of which were male sex buyers and three felony sex traffickers. Most notably, three juveniles, ages 13, 15, and 16, were rescued as a result of these operations.

# Officers & Programs Making a Positive Impact



## Unhoused Community Outreach

Over the past year, the Sacramento County Probation Department has been focusing on engaging our unhoused client population. Historically, Probation's unhoused clients have been challenging to supervise due to accessibility, mental health, substance abuse as well as their general mistrust of law enforcement. Probation has put significant efforts towards identifying resources to serve this underserved population. By developing relationships and partnerships with community-based organizations and other county agencies. In addition, Probation has increased visibility by conducting outreach in encampments and at shelter facilities to assist in building rapport and trust. As a result, referrals to programs, services, and shelters have increased. Overall, the clients have notably better outcomes and opportunities when working with Probation to obtain resources.

Officers from Adult Operations conduct check-ins at local shelters and provide care packages with basic necessities including socks, toothpaste and toothbrushes, body wipes, deodorant, and light snacks. Two officers participate as members of the [County Homeless Interagency Solutions Team \(HIST\)](#), to identify solutions to homelessness. In addition, Probation continues partners with the [Sacramento Sheriff's Office Homeless Outreach Team \(HOT\)](#).





# Keeping Our Community Safe

## DISTRICT 1

April 17, 2023  
800 Block of Marsh Creek Dr., Sacramento

Officers with the Investigation and Supervision Unit conducted a records check of an adult individual under supervision who was prohibited from owning or possessing any firearms and ammunition pursuant to Proposition 63. Additional investigation revealed a firearm was still registered to the individual. When contacted by officers, the individual voluntarily surrendered the firearm which was booked for safekeeping.



## DISTRICT 3

April 5, 2023  
4900 Block of Little Oak Lane, Sacramento

Probation officers assisted Sacramento County Sheriff's Deputies in a planned operation to conduct multiple compliance checks on individuals under supervision within a high crime activity area. Two warrant arrests were made and one individual was arrested for being in Possession of a Concealed Firearm. The individuals were booked into the Main Jail.



April 19, 2023  
1400 Block of Mission Avenue, Carmichael

During a home compliance check of an individual under supervision, officers from the Investigation and Supervision Unit seized the following:

- Approximately 400 rounds of live ammunition of various calibers
- Approximately 28 firearm parts and accessories
- Approximately 19 magazines
- An undisclosed amount of counterfeit currency
- Potential explosive devices
- Various AK-47 and AR-15 upper and lower receivers

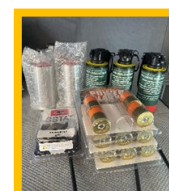
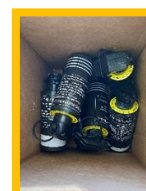
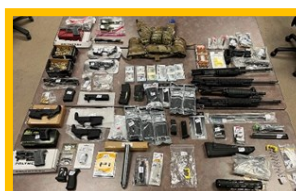
The individual was arrested and booked into the Main Jail for Felon in Possession of a Firearm, Felon in Possession of Ammunition, Transport of Large Capacity Magazines, Felon in Possession of Body Armor, Manufacture of Ammunition and Firearms, and Violation of Probation.



## DISTRICT 2

April 5, 2023  
7200 Block of Simon Street, Sacramento

During a home compliance check of an individual under supervision, Adult Field officers located a bolt action infield rifle with a magazine containing several rounds of ammunition and approximately 22 grams of methamphetamine. The individual was arrested and booked into the Main Jail for Possession of a Firearm by a Felon, Possession of Ammunition by a Prohibited Person, and Possession of Methamphetamine. A second adult individual was located booked into custody for an active warrant.



## DISTRICT 3 (CONTINUED)

April 19, 2023  
3600 Block of Whitney Avenue, Sacramento

Officers with the Investigation and Supervision Unit conducted a records check of an adult individual under supervision who was prohibited from owning or possessing any firearms and ammunition relative to Proposition 63. Further investigation revealed a 9mm pistol was still registered to the individual. During a search of the individual's residence, the firearm and various calibers of ammunition were located and booked for safekeeping. The individual was transported and booked for a Felon in Possession of a Firearm and a Felon in Possession of Ammunition.

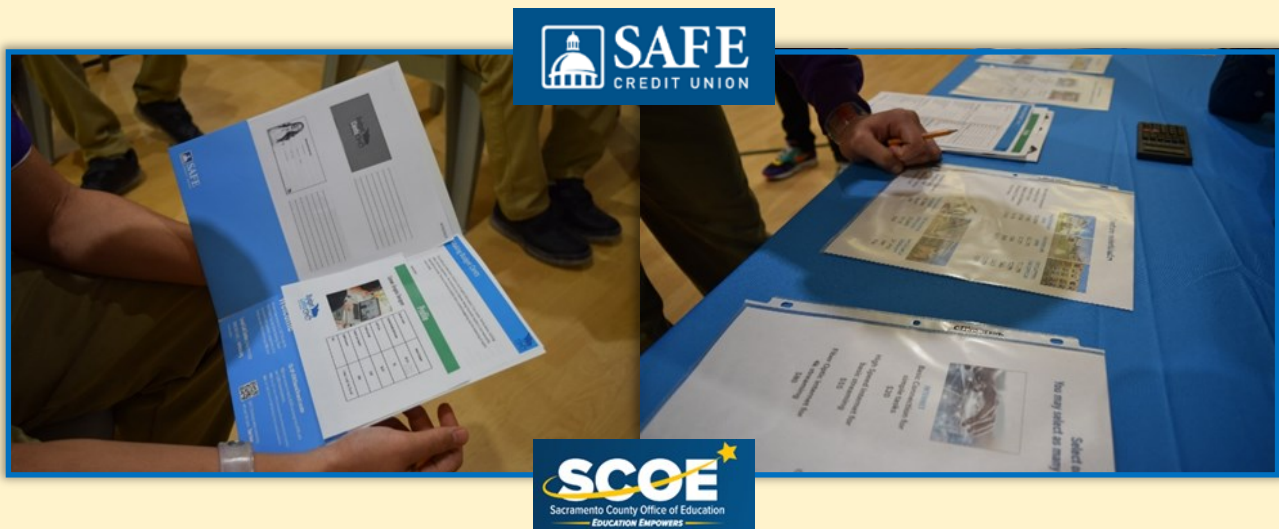
