Youth Detention Facility (YDF) News

Fourteen residents were selected from a variety of units within the Youth Detention Facility to form two teams of seven. The game was composed of two 15-minute halves. The team with the majority of Housing Unit 1 residents took the victory!



YDF Idol Competition Auditions

Residents from every unit were given the opportunity to audition for the 3rd annual YDF Idol. Some of the talents included performing skits, rapping, singing, poetry and playing the guitar. Of those that auditioned, the top 10 performances were selected by a team of judges. Each selected resident received their "golden ticket" to perform in the YDF Idol Finale in July.



Youth Community Outreach Unit (YCOU)

Youth are court ordered to participate in the Community Outreach Unit which provide opportunities for skill development and work skills. Recently, youth cleaned the outside courtyard of the Juvenile Court building. The youth assisted in power washing all the windows, outdoor tables, BBQ and swept the courtyard and dumped all the trash.

Inside of the Youth Detention Facility, YCOU swept and mopped all the floors in the entire YDF facility. The youth cleaned up Housing Unit 9, including all storage rooms, and the courtyard. The clothing closet was cleaned and organized by YCOU staff, and all extra items were delivered to the Sacramento Goodwill. The youth assisted in cleaning Housing Unit 13, including the showers and day space.

YCOU hosted a car wash for YDF transportation vehicles and Juvenile Field to bring their assigned cars over to be washed and vacuumed.
