This month, Supervising Probation Officers, Jacob Cullers, Christa Flewellyn and Jacqueline Valerio received an award for participating in the 2022 Organizational Culture Change Project. The goal of this project was to develop a plan for improving the culture of Sacramento County to a level that is productive, positive and more encourages employees to care more about each other. All county personnel were encouraged to participate in a survey and more than 1,100 county workers responded. From the survey a long list of values were produced. Our Supervising Probation Officers helped narrow down the list and created behaviors under each value. PRIDE was the acronym developed by the team with the core values of Principled, Respect, Innovation, Diversity and inclusion and Excellence. Chief Probation Officer Marlon Yarber accepted the awards on behalf of Supervising Probation Officers Flewellyn and Cullers who were unable to attend the event in person.

Forklift Certifications for LCA Clients



Leaders in Community Alternatives (LCA) partnered with Toyota Material Handling Northern California to provided forklift certification to our clients in the Adult Day Reporting Centers (ADRC) as well as the Accountability Collaborations and Treatment (ACT) program. This program is designed for our clients to achieve employment with their acquired skills so they can obtain higher wages.

During a compliance check of an individual on formal searchable probation, officers noticed several safes as well as pistol cases in various rooms of the residence located in plain sight. Subsequently, a search warrant was obtained for the entire residence. During the search, officers recovered multiple unsecured firearms and various rounds of ammunition in the rooms of other individuals. One individual was arrested for multiple firearms related charges.



Items Seized:

- .40 caliber Glock 23
- Winchester lever action rifle
- 9mm Glock 19
- .357 revolver
- AR upper receiver
- .12 gauge flare gun
- Various rounds of live ammunition
- Shotgun belt containing 15 rounds of ammunition

DISTRICT 3

February 1, 2023 1600 Block of Vernon Street, Roseville

Officers with the Investigations and Supervision Unit (ISU) of the Adult Field Division received a Proposition 63 Referral regarding an adult individual on formal searchable probation. During a scheduled office visit, officers searched the vehicle and located approximately 9 grams of psilocybin mushrooms. Subsequently, a probation search of his residence was conducted and officers seized miscellaneous firearm parts, 10 large capacity magazines, 1 high capacity extended magazine, live ammunition, 3 AR-15 lower receivers and 25 grams of psilocybin mushrooms. The individual was booked on various firearms charges as well as Possession of a Controlled Substance.



Items Seized:

- Approximately 805 rounds of various caliber live ammunition
- (3) AR-15 lower receivers
- (10) AR-15 magazines
- High capacity extended magazine
- Miscellaneous firearms parts
- 35 grams of psilocybin mushrooms
