Adult Court Wellness Team Commits to be Fit with County Wellness Grant Funds

In 2022, the Adult Court Division was awarded the Sacramento County Wellness Grant, which is supported and sponsored by the County of Sacramento Benefits Office.



To support a culture of wellness for employees, the Adult Court Wellness Team proposed promoting physical activity and movement by giving employees access to fun and creative workout classes, yoga, and

coaching within an on-site general wellness room.



Grant funds have been used to purchase exercise equipment to create on-site workout opportunities via streaming platforms. The Wellness Team also holds friendly competitions and encourages staff to participate in local events such as 5K runs, Doggy Dash, and The Color Run to maintain healthy lifestyles.





JANUARY HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS MONTH



SAFE Team Human Trafficking Operation Results

To help prevent human trafficking activity, officers from the <u>Sacramento County Sexual Assault Felony Enforcement (SAFE) Team*</u> conducted an operation focused on human trafficking offenders and victims.

Officers conducted compliance checks on probation clients with a history of human trafficking related charges. Officers and advocates with <u>Women Escaping a Violent Environment (WEAVE)</u> also met with victims of human trafficking with the intention of providing support and services.

During the operation, officers contacted an adult individual on formal searchable probation in North Highlands. During a search of the individual's

vehicle, officers located a stolen, loaded Glock 23 handgun with an extended magazine.

The adult was arrested on a Post Release Community Supervision Flash Incarceration and is pending charges of Felon in Possession of a Firearm, and Felon in Possession of Ammunition.





Search Results:

- 9 searches conducted
- 15 Probation contacts
- 1 firearm recovered
- 1 extended magazine recovered
- 1 fresh arrest
- Provided resources to 6 at risk individuals



*The SAFE Team is comprised of officers from Sacramento County Probation, the Sacramento Police Department, and the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office.

On January 25th, family, friends and staff celebrated the graduation of ten clients from our Central Adult Day Reporting Center (ADRC).







ADRC clients participate in cognitive behavioral treatment interventions, substance misuse treatment, self-help courses, educational programming, connection to housing, and vocational assistance. Clients also receive family support services, participate in pro-social activities, and pay victim restitution through participation with the Probation Community Outreach Unit (COU) work crew throughout the county.

Chief Probation Officer Marlon Yarber chairs the <u>Sacramento County</u> <u>Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC) Subcommittee</u>, and the JJCC has an exciting opportunity for community members to make a positive impact on justice-involved youth in our community by participation as a community member.



JJCC Subcommittee members help educate the public about Senate Bill 823, also known as Juvenile Justice Realignment, which gradually transfers the responsibility for managing youth housed at the California Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) from the state to local county jurisdictions. Additionally, they develop and provide program updates for Sacramento County's local Juvenile Justice Realignment Plan.

There is no term limit for JJCC Subcommittee community members. We are seeking to fill two community member seats.

Investigation Leads to Arrest for Fentanyl Sales

January 10, 2023 2100 Block of Oakmont Street, Sacramento

An officer with the Investigations & Supervision Unit (ISU) received information that an adult individual on informal searchable probation was involved with selling fentanyl.

After conducting an investigation, ISU officers coordinated with the <u>Sacramento Sheriff's Office Special Enforcement Detail (SED)</u> to execute a search warrant on the individual's residence. During the search, officers discovered fentanyl, methamphetamine, approximately \$11,000 in cash, and paraphernalia for conducting narcotic sales.

Officers with the <u>High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) Unit</u> responded and safely packaged the narcotics for booking. The individual was arrested for two felony charges related to narcotic sales.

Items Seized:

- ~ 300 grams Fentanyl
- ~ 100 grams methamphetamine
- ~ \$11,000 cash
- Multiple clear plastic baggies
- Digital scale



DISTRICT 2 (cont'd)

January 11, 2023 6000 Block Belleau Wood Lane, Sacramento

Officers obtained a search warrant for an adult individual who was prohibited from possessing firearms and was suspected to be illegally trafficking them. With the assistance of Sacramento County Sheriff's Office (SSO) detectives, the search warrant was served at the individual's residence.

During the search, officers located 4 large capacity magazines, a stolen Glock firearm, live ammunition, and an assault weapon. The individual was booked on multiple firearms related charges.



DISTRICT 4

January 4, 2023 7600 Block of Capricorn Drive, Citrus Heights

Probation officers conducted a search of an individual on formal searchable probation. During the search of the residence, officers located a loaded 9MM handgun. The individual was booked into Sacramento County Main Jail and is pending charges for Felon in Possession of a Firearm and Possession of Ammunition by a Prohibited Person.



January 20, 2023 200 Block of Natoma Station Drive, Folsom

During a records check, officers with the Adult Court Division discovered that an adult individual on formal searchable probation, who is prohibited from owning/possessing any firearms or ammunition, may be in possession of an outstanding Mossberg 12 gauge shotgun.

After being contacted by a Probation Officer, the client safely secured the shotgun along with 11 rounds of 12 gauge ammunition and relinquished them to a Probation Officer. The property was subsequently booked for safekeeping.





Youth Detention Facility (YDF) News

Battle of the Coaches

Youth participated in the inaugural Battle of the Coaches basketball games. Probation staff with the Leadership Education and Athletic Program (LEAP) drafted their teams and competed to see who coached the champion team.





NCCT Teamsters Apprentice Training

Northern California Construction Training (NCCT) in collaboration with the Northern California Teamsters Apprentice Training Program, held a 5 hour CPR, First Aid, and AED class and 2 hour Heat and Stress training for the youth enrolled in the program.





Sacramento Kings Coached YDF Youth in Life and Skills

The <u>Sacramento Kings</u> teamed up with the <u>Anti-Recidivism Coalition</u> and Probation to host a mentoring event for young men and women at the Youth Detention Facility. During the event, Kings President of Business Operations John Rinehart, and Kings Player Development Coach Lindsey Harding spoke with the youth about overcoming obstacles, embracing self-love, setting goals, and building life skills.

After the discussion, youth joined Harding and Jr. Kings coaches for a skills and drills clinic. Additionally, the youth received Kings swag. The Kings organization also donated basketball sneakers to the YDF basketball program.



SOAR Program Deans Honor List Luncheon

The Scholars Obtaining Academic Responsibility (SOAR) college program held a luncheon for the residents who earned a spot on the Dean's Honor List for the winter quarter.
