Multi-County Collaboration Protecting Youth



The Probation Department was proud to be one of 15 law enforcement agencies that participated in the Sacramento Valley Hi-Tech Crimes Task Force Operation "Secret Admirer" which took place between February 14, 2023 and March 1, 2023.

There were 18 people arrested from five different counties. The individuals arrested had the intent to meet with a minor and commit a sex crime.

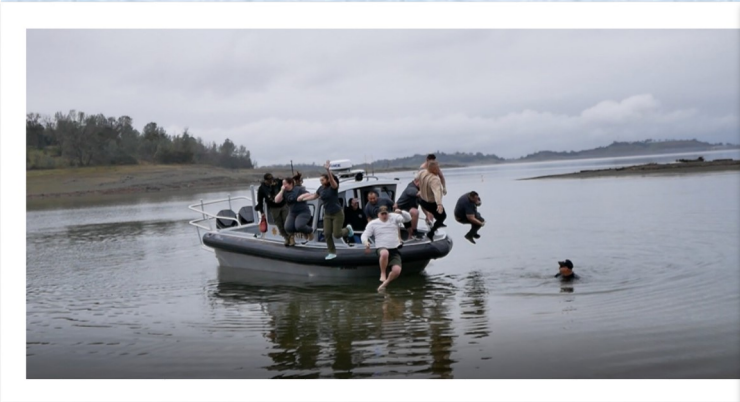
Officers & Programs Making a Positive Impact

Keeping Our Community Safe

DISTRICT 1

March 10, 2023

3600 Block of Norwood Avenue, Sacramento

An individual recently convicted of a felony disclosed to probation officers he had given his unregistered hunting rifle to a relative. Probation officers assigned to the Investigations and Supervision Unit (ISU) contacted the relative, who surrendered the firearm relative to Proposition 63. Subsequently, the 12 gauge shotgun was booked for safekeeping.



DISTRICT 3

March 14, 2023

5900 Block of Palm Drive, Carmichael

Probation officers with the Investigation and Supervision Unit (ISU) observed two individuals in a parked vehicle. Further investigation revealed the driver and owner of the vehicle was on Post Release Community Supervision. A search of the vehicle recovered the following:

- Approximately 181 grams of Fentanyl
- Approximately 1 gram of methamphetamine
- \$500 cash
- Baggies
- Scale
- Several Xanax pills

Both individuals were arrested and booked for Possession of a Controlled Substance with the Intent to Sell.

DISTRICT 2

March 9, 2023

7600 Block of 23rd Street, Sacramento

During a home compliance check of an individual on formal probation, officers located four expended shotgun shells and a 45 caliber firearm containing 12 live rounds in the magazine. The individual was arrested and booked into the Sacramento County Main Jail and is pending charges of Felon in Possession of a Firearm and Felon in Possession of Ammunition.



March 23, 2023

5800 Block of Hemlock Street, Sacramento

Probation officers contacted an individual on Post Release Community Supervision at his reported address for a compliance check. A search was conducted and officers seized an unregistered firearm and suspected narcotics.

The individual was arrested and booked in the Sacramento County Main Jail and is pending the charge of Felon in Possession of a Firearm.



DISTRICT 4

March 13, 2023

8100 Block of Sunrise Blvd, Citrus Heights

Officers with the Adult Court Division conducted a records check of an adult individual under supervision who was prohibited from owning or possessing any firearms and ammunition relative to Proposition 63. Additional investigation revealed a 12 gauge shotgun was still registered to the individual. When contacted by officers, the individual voluntarily surrendered the firearm which was then booked for safekeeping.

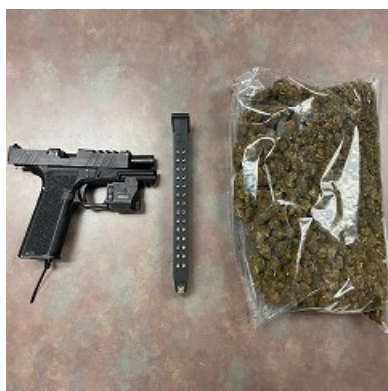


DISTRICT 5

March 13, 2023

9400 block of Butterfield Way, Sacramento

Juvenile Field officers received information that a juvenile under supervision may be hiding a firearm in the backyard of his residence. When officers conducted a probation search, they located approximately 118 grams of marijuana in the youth's bedroom as well as a semi-automatic firearm with a loaded 31 round high capacity magazine hidden in the backyard. The youth was arrested and booked into the Youth Detention Facility.



March 8, 2023

5600 Block of Tares Circle, Elk Grove

Officers conducted a records check of an adult individual under supervision who was prohibited from owning or possessing firearms and ammunition relative to Proposition 63. Further investigation revealed a 12 gauge shotgun was still registered to the individual, but was being stored at a relative's home. Probation officers with the Investigations and Supervision Unit (ISU) met with the individual's relative and took possession of the shotgun and booked it for safekeeping.



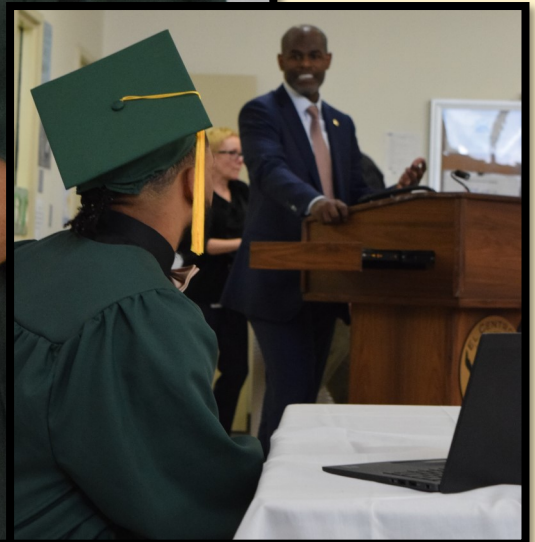
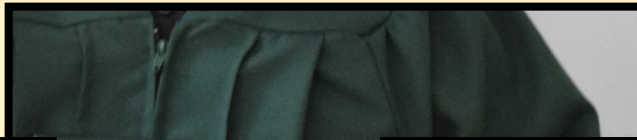


Youth Detention Facility (YDF) News
