Weekly Activity Log

The following information listed in the Weekly Activity Log provides a snapshot of significant actions by Probation Officers in the community of Sacramento. The events reported are preliminary actions, taken in the field by Probation Officers, and may or may not be referred for further investigation. Certain details of these incidents have been removed due to potential follow up investigation and/or for privacy rights.

Week of October 14, 2019 to October 18, 2019

October 17, 2019: (Probation Compliance Operation)

Officers from the Adult Community Corrections North Unit conducted a one-night probation compliance operation targeting probation clients difficult to contact during normal business hours due to school, work, or other circumstances. As a result of the operation, officers compiled the following stats:

- 7 Home Visits (Probation clients/Post Release Community Supervision contacts)
- 6 Probation Searches
- 1 Home Visit attempt
- 1 Field Visit
- 1 Warrant
- 2 Fresh Arrests for Possession of a Controlled Substance and Possession of Methamphetamine

October 17, 2019: (Felon in Possession of a Firearm) (Possession of Controlled Substance for Sales) (Possession of Marijuana-Sales)

Officers from the Adult Community Corrections Central Unit attempted to contact a probation client at his listed address. The probation client was not present, however they were permitted entry to verify his living arrangements within the home. In plain sight, officers located a semi-automatic handgun. A subsequent search of the residence produced an additional sawed-off shotgun, marijuana, a large amount of cash, live rounds of .9mm ammunition, promethazine bottles without prescriptions, and marijuana paraphernalia including digital scales. Along with the contraband, there was an 8-month old child living in the residence. Two adult subjects were subsequently arrested for various charges including: child endangerment, possession of a controlled substance, loaded firearm and possession of marijuana for sales. The probation client was located at an alternate address and also arrested for violation of probation. The infant child was taken by Child Protective Services and the case will be referred to the D.A. for drug endangered children. All three of the subjects were booked at the Sacramento Main Jail.
