

### **Juvenile Field Services**

Juvenile Field Services (JFS) utilizes evidence-based, trauma-informed, family-focused strategies to aid in the wellness and rehabilitation of youth and families who find themselves involved in the juvenile justice system.

Officers conduct detailed risk assessments in order to determine the appropriate level of supervision.

# CAU Candidacy Assessment Unit

- Once the youth is placed on Probation the CAU process begins
- CAU Officers complete Risk/Needs assessments to determine potential for recidivism and to identify strengths
- Youth are also evaluated for imminent risk of being removed from home
  - A "reasonable candidate" as defined by Title IV-E
- Referrals to evidence-based community interventions are selected based on the youth's individual risks and needs
- Connections to programs are often made on-site



## CAU Candidacy Assessment Unit

- Once the youth is placed on Probation the CAU process begins

### 2 Mental Health clinicians are assigned to JFS Juvenile Justice Intervention Services (JJIS)

Serviced by Stanford Sierra Youth & Families

Provides needs-based counseling, skill building, peer and family support, and linkage to community-based services

Health insurance status does not affect enrollment

#### **Juvenile Justice Diversion Treatment Program (JJDTP)**

A Full-Service partnership with River Oak Center for Children

Targets youth with complex needs due to serious emotional/psychological disturbance

### Consultation, Support, and Engagement Team (CSET) for CSEC

Facilitated by Stars Behavioral Health Group

Targets the specific needs of youth who have been, or are at-risk of being, exploited

### **BCLC Community Partners**

Continuation of the Reduction of African American Child Deaths campaign

Various community partners work directly with JFS Officers

#### **Juvenile Sexual-Offender Treatment**

Serviced through Hope for Healthy Families

Intense treatment to develop safe and prosocial behaviors

#### **VOYA Continuing Care**

Transitional support provided by Stanford Sierra Youth & Families

## Community Resource Guides can link clients with additional services throughout Sacramento



### **VOYA Re-Entry**

- VOYA youth have the most serious offenses and the highest-risk
- VOYA Re-Entry follows each youth through their Secure Track commitment and provides continuous, focused case management
- Connections are made with family and personal supports, which includes a pre-release
   Home Evaluation
- VOYA Re-Entry Officers assist the youth with developing their own Re-Entry Case Plan
- Officers continue-on to provide Step-Down and post-discharge community supervision
