



**Youth Detention Facility  
OPERATIONS ORDER**

**ADMINISTRATIVE FURLOUGH**

**Purpose and Scope**

Administrative Furlough is a program used in lieu of detention for those youth sentenced to serve Ricardo M. time. After serving half of the Ricardo M. time, youth are evaluated by a furlough board once a week to determine if they are eligible for participation in the program.

The board consists of Chief Deputies from the Youth Detention Facility, Juvenile Court and Field Services (or their designees); who each have one (1) vote. A youth must have two (2) out of three (3) votes to be released on administrative furlough. The votes are based on a youth's adjustment while housed at the Youth Detention Facility, and a parent or guardian willing to support the agreement of the furlough program

Administrative furloughs are usually released on Home Supervision unless a Court order specifically states the youth must be on Electronic Monitoring.

If a youth on administrative furlough violates, they will be returned to the Youth Detention Facility. A Morrissey Hearing shall be held with 48 Court hours in which the Chief Deputies of the Youth Detention Facility, Juvenile Court and Field Services determine the youth's disposition. Options are to have the youth serve the remaining time in custody, all their time in custody, or return to furlough.


